


RESTORATION ISN'T JUST FOR COLLECTORS



IS YOUR INTERIOR INFERIOR ?

Many of us spend more time in our cars than we do in our living rooms. So why shouldn't the furniture, carpeting and ceiling of that second "living room" get its share of attention? Good car-keeping improves driving pleasure and safety, and helps the value of your vehicle.



1. Periodically, clean door panels, upholstery, carpeting and dash. All fabrics last longer when they're clean and given a protective treatment.

2. Repair or replace worn or damaged parts like sun visors, padded dash, door panels. As a cut or tear grows, so does the repair bill. 3. Why put up with a torn or sagging headliner? Not only is this unsightly, it can also obstruct vision. New padded headliners are readily available, in expensive to replace.

NOTE: Heat can loosen headlining. Prevent further damage by keeping windows cracked in hot weather.

4. The floor covering in your car, truck or van takes a lot more punishment than in your home. For a fresh look replace worn carpeting.

WARNING: Don't take chances with a wear hole in the carpeting below the accelerator pedal. It can catch a heel when braking.

5. Just as body dents and scratches grow worse with age, so do tears and worn spots on seat upholstery. Literally, the stitch in time can save complete replacement of upholstery and padding.

6. How are your seat belts? Is the fabric strong enough to save you in a collision? REMEMBER: WORN, DAMAGED SEAT BELTS CAN/SHDULD BE REPLACED.
